Street Highlights the Return of First Weekend Palm Desert

Palm Desert continues to be the destination for an inspiring and fun-filled weekend of arts and culture each month with the return of First Weekend in November.

The excitement begins on Friday, November 6, and continues throughout the weekend with an exciting lineup of free events highlighted by Street – a unique celebration of music, art, fashion and food inspired by street culture – on Saturday, November 7, from 5 to 10 p.m. on the deck at Westfield Palm Desert.



Focused around energetic art and music with a hip-hop flare, Street will feature unique art walls and sculptures curated by the Coachella Valley art scene as well as live music from artists including DJ Alf Alpha and the Pleyboyz, Speak, Thr3 Strykes, Nikko Gray, and Cakes. Local favorite Stuff Pizza, as well as food trucks from Los Angeles and Orange County, will provide mouthwatering treats in an outdoor setting that offers some of the Valley's most breathtaking views.

Street is just one of the many exciting cultural events featured as part of First Weekend Palm Desert. Starting every first Friday of the month, and continuing throughout the weekend, the public is invited to discover a celebration of world-class arts and entertainment in Palm Desert, from guided art tours and musical theater, to classic cars and concerts.

In conjunction with First Weekend and El Paseo After Dark, the Palm Springs Art Museum in Palm Desert will host First Fridays at the gallery from 4 to 8 p.m. beginning November 6. These fun, free events feature live music, performance art, and film screenings every first Friday of the month, November through May. Participants will be able to view the current exhibition on display in the gallery followed by entertainment in the Faye Sarkowsky Sculpture Garden from 5 to 7 p.m.

First Weekend partners include El Paseo Shopping District, Palm Springs Art Museum in Palm Desert, El Paseo Cruise Night, Palm Desert Public Art Program, the McCallum Theatre, the Gardens on El Paseo, Westfield Palm Desert, the Living Desert, and the Indian Wells Theater at Cal State.

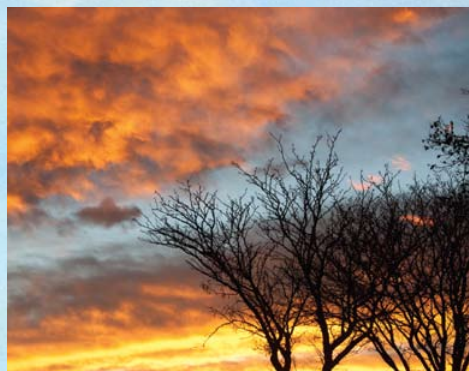

GENERAL PLAN UPDATE

Mapping Palm Desert's Future

Palm Desert has changed a great deal since its incorporation in 1973. Today, our community is poised for more exciting changes as the City plans how Palm Desert will develop over the next 20 years through an update of its general Plan.

As part of the update process, the City is reaching out to organizations and agencies as well as groups of residents, business owners, and other stakeholders who would like to learn more about the proposed changes.

A general plan guides a city's physical development including buildings, roads, parks, and other key infrastructure. Palm Desert's existing general Plan was written in the early 2000s and adopted in 2004. The 20-month update process, which began in June 2014, is building upon the City's recently adopted vision Palm Desert Strategic Plan, which outlined a new 20-year vision for the community along with specific goals designed to realize that vision.

Areas that have been identified for the most change under the updated general Plan include the highway 111 corridor, the undeveloped lands west of the Cal State and UC campuses, and San Pablo Avenue from Magnesia Falls Drive to El Paseo.

Key concepts include creating a walkable, landscaped, community space on San Pablo with wide sidewalks, shade trees, a cycle track, and reduced traffic lanes; reworking the frontage roads on highway 111 to make them flow more easily and provide wider sidewalks and enhanced landscaping; and permitting new development of taller, mixed-use buildings at strategic locations.

An administrative draft of the new general Plan has been completed and the associated environmental impact report is expected to be completed and ready for public review before the end of the year. Public hearings before Palm Desert's Planning Commission and City Council are expected to take place in early 2016.

Furry Face Joins Force

The Palm Desert Police Department's newest member comes from the Netherlands, is 3½ years old, and has a wet, black nose. His name is Rio and he is a Belgian Malinois (pronounced malinwa) police service dog.

Rio and his handler, Deputy Patrick Mushinski, have already completed basic canine training and narcotics detection school and are busy patrolling the streets of Palm Desert. Serious police work is Rio's primary job, including suspect apprehension and narcotics detection.

Sun City Palm Desert resident Maria Malter donated \$15,000 to the City to pay for the purchase and training of a new police dog to take the place of Van Snapp, who recently retired after serving as the City's police dog since 2007.

In addition to sometimes dangerous police work, Rio and Mushinski, who has worked out of the Palm Desert Sheriff's Station for four years, also serve as ambassadors for the Palm Desert Police Department making appearances and demonstrations at schools and local events.

"Everybody loves dogs," Mushinski said, adding that Rio does not have the police dog's stereotypical gruff personality. "He's actually really sweet, very playful, and silly. He's a good dog."

Open City Hall is an online forum exclusively for Palm Desert residents. Participation is easy. Simply go to www.peakdemocracy.com/3092 and click on the Open Town Hall link.

When you post your first statement, you will be asked for your name and home address. This confidential information is exclusively used to confirm that statements are being posted by Palm Desert residents and not by people outside the community.

Open City Hall is operated by Peak Democracy, a non-partisan company whose mission is to broaden civic engagement and build public trust in government. Their strict privacy agreement ensures that your information is kept confidential.

As with any public comment process, participation in Open City Hall is voluntary. City leaders will review posted statements and incorporate the input into their decision-making process along with other public input.

However you choose to participate in your local government, thank you for helping to make Palm Desert an even better place to live, work, and play.
