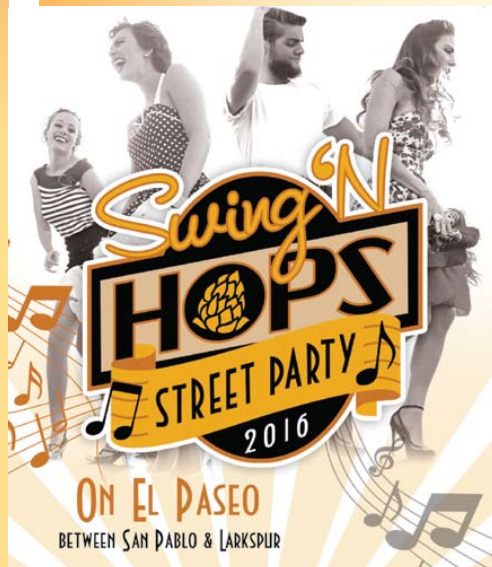

## First Weekend Fun Continues with Color Run and Swing 'N Hops



The new year is set to deliver more first Weekend fun highlighted by the return of a popular fit and fabulous favorite in January and the February debut of an exciting new event that will bring live music, swing dancing, and craft beer to the heart of El Paseo.

The fun begins on Friday, January 8, and continues throughout the weekend, with an exciting lineup of free events highlighted by the Palm Springs Art Museum in Palm Desert's third annual Galen New Year's Resolution 5k Color Run on Saturday, January 9.

Runners and families can kick off their resolutions for a healthy new year by burning some holiday-induced calories at this colorful event.

Held on a USA Track and Field certified course, the race begins and ends at the Palm Springs Art Museum in Palm Desert with registration at 6 a.m. and the race starts at 8 a.m. Food, music, and interactive art activities in the Faye Sarkowsky Sculpture Garden will round out the day's festivities.

On Saturday, February 6, the first Weekend party swings into full gear with the debut of the Swing 'N Hops Street Party on El Paseo. This fun, first-time event takes place outdoors from noon to 4 p.m. in the heart of Palm Desert's upscale shopping and dining district, El Paseo. Held in the street between San Pablo Avenue and Larkspur Lane, the four-hour dance party pairs live music by the Jennifer Keith Quintet with swing dance instruction, craft beer gardens, gourmet street food, swing era fashions, interactive art projects, and a vintage car show.

These are just two of the many cultural events featured as part of first Weekend Palm Desert. ## Farmers Market Returns to Morning Hours

Back by popular demand, Palm Desert's Certified farmers' Market has returned to Wednesday mornings, giving residents and visitors an opportunity to enjoy the sunshine while shopping for fresh, regionally grown fruits and vegetables and other artisanal products.

After trying evening hours, the weekly farmers' Market will now take place from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. every Wednesday. Market organizers said that while the evening market was popular in the spring when days were longer, a large number of regular customers, farmers, and vendors had asked that the market return to its popular morning time.

Located at the western intersection of Highway 111 and El Paseo, 72559 Highway 111, Palm Desert's market is one of only three state and county Certified farmers' Markets in the Coachella Valley. "Certified" means all the produce from participating vendors has been grown at California farms registered and inspected by their county agriculture departments. ## Popular HALF MARATHON and 5K DEBUT in Palm Desert

On Sunday, January 24 at 7 a.m., the 18th annual new balance Palm Desert Half Marathon and 5k will make its debut in an exciting and scenic new location - Civic Center Park.

After 17 years in Palm Springs, the popular event moves to the heart of the Coachella valley with the same attention to detail and quality that participants have come to expect for nearly two decades.

This year's Palm Desert Half Marathon and 5k will feature a more competitive, runner friendly course while continuing to embrace walkers and dogs. Expanded post-race festivities will include more food options and a beer garden presented by Coachella valley brewing Company.

# Palm Desert's ART DOCUMENTARY FILM SERIES Celebrates Eighth Season



Discover inspiring and thought provoking cinema at the 2016 Palm Desert art Documentary film series. The popular series' eighth season of free, art-themed documentaries begins January 21 with a screening of *Sol Lewitt: Wall Drawings*.

The film focuses on a celebrated retrospective of the art of Sol Lewitt, who during a four-decade long career produced more than 1,200 wall drawings using a deliberately limited repertoire of lines and geometric shapes to create works of remarkable complexity. A question and answer session with Steven Biller, editor-at-large for *Palm Springs Life* and contributing writer to *Art Ltd* will follow the screening.

The documentary film series is presented by the City of Palm Desert Public Art Department and the University of California, Riverside Palm Desert Graduate Center. All films screen the third Thursday of the month, January through April, at 6 p.m. in the auditorium at UCR Palm Desert, 75080 Frank Sinatra Drive. Each screening will include a featured speaker who will answer questions about that night's film. Admission is free, but reservations are recommended. Directed by Barbara Freed, *A Model for Matisse* documents the association between the nun sister Jacques-Marie and Henri Matisse. The Palm Desert Community Gallery features artwork from Paul J. Hamel and Randall Weidner in its new exhibition, *Mandalas and Fragments*, on display January 28 – April 8. The public is invited to a reception to honor the artists on Monday, February 1, from 5:30 to 7 p.m.

Taking a modern twist on traditional mandalas, Paul Hamel's artwork tells stories that symbolize life's paths and journeys. He moved to Palm Springs after retiring from a career as a principal with the Los Angeles Unified School District. Now, a part-time English-as-second-language instructor at College of the Desert, Hamel employs his knowledge of graphic design and computer software to create his works.

Randall Weidner began his career as a registered architect and, after many years of practice, returned to his first love – creating art fulltime. He fully envisions what a completed painting will look like prior to the first brushstroke. The Palm Springs resident attributes this approach to his career, where he had to finalize blueprints prior to breaking ground for construction.

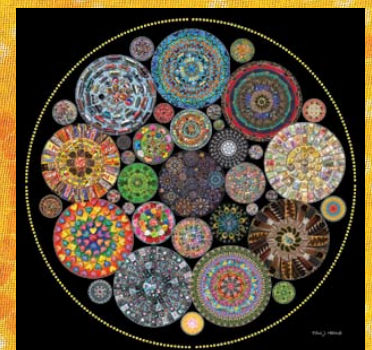
Hosted by the Palm Desert Police Department in the soccer Park's south parking lot, the event will provide expert safety inspections of car seats to ensure that each seat is properly fitted for the child it is intended to protect. Parents are encouraged to bring their children to the event to ensure an accurate fit.

In addition to inspecting the car seats, experts from the Palm Desert Police Department and the Riverside County Injury Prevention Center will make appropriate adjustments and provide instruction on how to properly install car seats. Educational materials will also be provided, including information about applicable laws and when a child should transition to a new seat.
